COMMITTEE REPORT

The following is a summary of items discussed by the Executive and full Committee since the last newsletter in February 2021. We have continued to meet online online by Zoom – except for the August 2021 Exec meeting! As always if there is anything you think we should be discussing at a future meeting please let Ruth know.

Admin matters

Even though we have not been rehearsing work has carried on behind the scenes and all relevant policies have been kept up to date as per our Action plan. In particular the Health and Safety Policy, Contingency Plan and Risk Management Policy have had various areas revised as a result of the Covid pandemic

Membership Matters

We were delighted that so many people carried on making enquiries about joining HCS during lockdown. By the time we restarted rehearsals in September 2021 a few were not able to join us as their lives had changed but we still had 17 people came to our first few rehearsals and 12 of them have already passed their voice tests and been accepted as Members. We have temporarily frozen inviting potential new members to rehearsals until after the November concert as we have to make sure we have enough physical space to allow everyone to rehearse safely but still maintain some social distancing.

New Music Director

Since the last newsletter the Trustees have been advertised for the new Music Director, received nine applications, shortlisted candidates for interview and from them invited two candidates to take a rehearsal each – in effect having an audition with the choir! The audition rehearsals were made more complicated by the fact that we were still rehearsing in shifts so they had half the choir for an hour, then the other half. Both were extremely good and well received by the choir but after taking everything into consideration David Lawrence was appointed and will be conducting the first concert of the season.

Future Concerts

After a long absence we are finally able to announce concerts would take place again. The Committee decided that the first concert of the season would be that originally planned for Autumn 2020 – ie Brahms Requiem, it was also decided to use the two piano accompaniment. This allowed the concert to include Elgar's Enigma Variations arranged for two pianos which should attract a wide range of people. Two other choral works by Elgar are included to fill the programme out. It was agreed that - as he had not been to conduct us for some time - we would ask our President Brian Kay to conduct Messiah on 11th December with the Manchester Camerata and we were delighted that he accepted. We also invited Andrew Padmore to return as guest conductor for the Rossini and Puccini concert in March 2022 as he had prepared us so well for the concert of the season is currently planned for 11 June 2022 but it will be up to our new Music Director to determine what we perform. This will be followed by the Harrogate Prom on 25 June 2022 which has also been postponed from 2020. The Committee decided that we should experiment with a slightly earlier start to our Saturday evening concerts, 7.00pm.

Rehearsal Planning

During the year the possibility of outdoor rehearsals was contemplated but ultimately it was decided they would just not be practicable. During the summer of 2021 as things improved the Commmittee took on board the guidance from Making Music on returning to rehearsals and for the first few weeks we sang in shifts with the chairs well spaced out. We have completed full Covid risk assessments for rehearsals and concerts and for the latter will be following the government guidance in force at the time in respect of audience seating, etc. We continue to rehearse with fewer people present that normal as a number of members has chosen not to return just yet. We have also purchased an air quality monitoring device and see through plastic screens which are placed in front of the piano and conductor.

INTRODUCING DAVID LAWRENCE



David Lawrence is one of the UK's most versatile conductors, working with orchestras, symphony choruses and national youth choirs. He was recently nominated for a Gramophone Award for his conducting, has recently been awarded a prestigious ARAM by the Royal Academy of Music, and holds the Guinness World Record for conducting the UK's largest choir.

David's work has taken him to Singapore, Colombia, Canada, the United States, India, the United Arab Emirates, throughout Europe, and Australia. His positive and engaging manner makes him a popular guest conductor, and he is an experienced and respected trainer of choral conductors. With particular experience in the field of contemporary music, David has prepared and conducted premiére performances by Per

Nørgård, Pierre Boulez, Iannis Xenakis, Mauricio Kagel, Graham Fitkin, James Wood, Bob Chilcott and others. As a guest chorusmaster of the Netherlands Radio Choir he has worked with many conductors such as Kenneth Montgomery, Frans Brüggen, and John Adams, and in 2002 working closely with Stockhausen he also conducted this exceptional choir in the German premiére of Scene II from his opera Sontag aus Licht.

David has conducted the London Philharmonic Choir, Hallé Choir, London Symphony Chorus, the CBSO Chorus for whom he is an Associate Conductor, and the national youth choirs of Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales. He has directed large scale education projects with the Orchestra of Welsh National Opera, the English Symphony Orchestra, the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra and of course the CBSO. In 2011 David conducted an award winning performance of Beethoven's 9th Symphony with the Barrier Reef Orchestra in Queensland, and has conducted the CBSO in a massed performance of Carmina Burana, the Orchestra of Opera North with their Inspiration Choir, Vaughan WIlliam's Sea Symphony for Hull's City of Culture Festival and the BBC Philharmonic Orchestra and Huddersfield Choral Society for the BBC's Songs of Praise.

David is Choral Advisor to Sinfonia Viva with whom he has worked closely since 1998. He is the conductor of the London Symphony Orchestra's Community Choir and Senior Youth Choir, and as Principal Conductor of Young Voices, a position he has held for 20 years, directs massed choirs in an annual series of concerts with some choirs incorporating more than 8,000 singers!

As President of the Harrogate Choral Society I am delighted to hear of the appointment of David Lawrence as conductor, following fifteen years under the leadership of Andrew Padmore. David arrives as we all emerge from the many difficult months of pandemic which have made it impossible for choirs to sing and orchestras to play and he will no doubt apply his inspirational skills to the rebuilding of the voices, the confidence and the joy of those whose good fortune it is to sing in the choir. I wish him well as he takes the Choral Society into the next stage of its distinguished musical journey.
